

Plan	Usage
Business Continuity Plan (BCP)	Provides procedures for recovery of those functions that are deemed routine business and not mission essential
Continuity Of Operations Plan (COOP)	Provides procedures for the recovery of Mission Essential Functions (MEFs).
Crisis Communications Plan	Provides guidance for disseminating information to internal staff/employees as well as dealing with the media and other external agencies and entities.
Critical Infrastructure Plan (CIP)	This is applicable only if your organization is responsible for ensuring the availability of a portion of the nationally critical infrastructure as identified in the National Infrastructure Protection Plan (NIPP).
Disaster Recovery Plan (DRP)	A DRP is used when an incident affects your entire data center to the point where relocation to an alternate processing center is required. A DRP will support COOP and BCPs and may itself be supported by contingency plans
Incident Response Plan (IRP)	This provides the procedures for protecting your IT infrastructure against, and response to, cyber attacks and malicious code infections.
Information System Contingency Plan (ISCP)	These are plans that provide restoral procedures for individual IT systems and are submitted as part of Certification and Accreditation (C&A) packages.
Occupant Emergency Plan (OEP)	OEPs are emergency response procedures for the initial response and prior to invoking recovery plans. Two integral portions of an OEP are evacuation procedures and Shelter in Plan procedures.
